

FEAST OF THE WEEK:

The Nativity of the Blessed Virgin Mary (8 September)

From a sermon of John of Ford (1140-1214), abbot of a Cistercian house at Forde, Dorset
 When Jesus was speaking to the crowds, it was not one of the band of the apostles, not one of the council of elders, but simply one of the women there in the crowd who 'lifted up her voice' (see Luke 11:27), and proclaimed that the womb that bore Him was blessed. The example of this woman has given me the courage to dare, in my turn, to say something about the blessedness of this womb. And in sober truth, above all that can be said or thought, that womb is blessed indeed, pregnant with so sacred an offspring, heavy with so light a burden, guardian of a trust so precious. That womb is a marriage chamber of very great tenderness, rich in the most noble seed, and it contains a great and very holy secret. It has knowledge of great mystery and it bears very great dignity.

But clearly, that womb was blessed even before it carried the Lord. Day and night, with a most pure desire and the longing of a hold an consecrated love, it prepared itself to bear its holy burden. In the silence of her heart, Mary said to herself: 'Let him kiss me with the kiss of his mouth' (Song of Songs 1:1). There has never been another soul, or rather, there has never been one of the blessed spirit, not even from that most blissful of the nine choirs that takes its name from the fire of charity and refreshes the heat of its immense love by the continual contemplation of eternity and the ceaseless praise of the holy Trinity: no, not even among the cherubim has any one made progress like hers in desiring and receiving this kiss.

So then, to maker her ready for such grace, from her mother's womb she was fashioned by Him who established the heavens, and every single moment, during the successive stages by which God established her, the fullness of grace was built up. One day she would become God's mother, and then an angel would call her 'full of grace' (*Luke 1:28). So her womb is blessed in the very manner of its establishment in blessedness, yet it is far more blessed when it finally, in a divine and indescribable way, receives its most blessed burden. Blessed indeed, though, most blessed, is that womb when it bore Him, when it formed Him, when it was in labour with Him, when it brought Him to birth.

In short, just as all grace and glory flowed from this woman's body, so it can be said that every generation of saints truly arose from her by what we can only call the wonderful mystery of divine fruitfulness. Let me repeat it: the mother of Jesus is not only the mother of our glorious head, Jesus Christ, Mediator between God and man, but she is also the mother of all who love Jesus, of the whole of Jesus' sacred body.

Impart to your servants, we pray, O Lord, the gift of heavenly grace, that the Feast of the Nativity of the Blessed Virgin may bring deeper peace to those for whom the birth of her Son was the dawning of salvation. Through Christ our Lord. Amen.
