

AVE REGINA CAELORUM

From 3 February, we sing the fourth of the Anthems to Our Lady which we have been learning. This one lasts until Holy Week, and we pick up with the *Regina Caeli* after Easter. There follows a literal translation, showing that you know more Latin than you thought you did! One thing to note is the increasing intensity of the salutations: Ave, Ave, Salve, Vale—these show increasing regard for the Mother of God whom we greet. Next week, ‘The Theology of the *Ave Regina Caelorum*.’

Ave Regína caelórum
Hail, Greetings| Queen (as in EILR, *Elizabeth Regina* on postboxes)| heavens-of the

Ave Dómina Angelórum
Hail...| Domina = Lady (see the monastic title *Dom*, short for Dominus)| angels-of the

Salve rádix, salve pórtá,
Greetings| root (= Root of Jesse, like ‘radical’)| greetings| door, gate, like ‘portal’
—as you might have on a Victorian doormat

Ex qua mún-do lux est orta:
Out of (like ex-it)| which, whom| to-the-world, like *mundane*| light| has come (like *or-igin*)

Gaude Virgo gloriósa
Rejoice!| Virgin| glorious describing *Virgo*
—*Gaude to one person, Gaudete to a group, as in Gaudete Sunday*

Super omnes speciósa
Above (like ‘superimpose’)| everything, everyone, all| chosen, like special|

Vale, o valde decóra,
Hail/Farewell| O| very, really, extremely| beautiful, fine (like *decorous*)

Et pro nobis Christum exóra.
And| for| us| to-Christ| pour out prayer (ex = out, ora = pray)

And now a poetic translation:

Hail, thou Queen of Heaven enthroned, hail, by Angels Mistress owned
Root of Jesse, Gate of Morn, whence the world’s true light was born.
Glorious Virgin, joy to thee, loveliest whom in heaven they see,
Fairest thou where all are fair, plead with Christ our sins to spare.

PATRON SAINT OF THE INTERNET? At the age of 7, Carlo Acutis decided to go to Mass and pray the Rosary every day. He loved computers and later decided to undertake a project to collate and put online all Eucharistic Miracles that the Church has authenticated, see his work here www.miracolieucaistici.org. Shortly after completing this project, he became ill with what seemed to be a virus, but which was a virulent form of leukaemia. He died just one week later in 2006, at the age of 15. Moves are currently afoot to have Carlo Acutis recognised as a saint, and as a Patron Saint of the Internet.
