

Here are two extracts for this week from English devotional literature of the early 15th century. The first, on the Body of Christ, is by Nicholas Love, and is from his *Mirror of the Blessed Life of Jesus Christ*, published around 1410. It has been reckoned the most popular devotional work in English of that age. The second, on the Five Wounds, concentrating on the wound in Our Lord's side, is anonymous, and appears in a collection put together by Mgr Robert Hugh Benson.

CORPUS CHRISTI

Take heed, you Christian, and especially you Priest, how devoutly, how diligently and truly, the Lord Jesus first made this precious Sacrament, and afterwards with His blessed hands ministered it, and communicated that blessed—His beloved—company. And on the other side, take heed with what devout wonder they first saw Him make that wonderful and excellent Sacrament, and afterwards with what dread and reverence they took it and received it of Him.

This is that sweet and precious Memorial that in sovereign manner makes man's soul worthy and pleasing to God, as often as it is properly received, either by true and devout meditation on his Passion or, and that more especially, in sacramental eating of it. Thus rightly this excellent gift of love should kindle man's soul and inflame it. For there is nothing that He might give or leave to us that is dearer, sweeter, more profitable, than Himself. For without any doubt, He whom we receive in the Sacrament of the Altar is Himself God's Son Jesus, who took flesh and blood and was born of the Virgin Mary and suffered death on the Cross for us, and rose the third day from death to life, and afterwards went up into heaven and sits on the Father's right side, who shall come in the day of judgement and judge all mankind. In whose power is both life and death, who made both heaven and hell, and who only may save us or damn us.

And so He who is himself God and man is contained in that little Host which you see in form of bread, and daily is offered up to the Father of heaven for our spiritual health and everlasting salvation.

SACRED HEART

Behold especially the five most notable wounds: two in His blessed hands, and two in His blessed feet, and the most open wound in His right side.

The largest and deepest wound, that which is in Christ's right side, is the well of everlasting life. There seize up the water of joy and blessing without end, beholding there how Christ Jesus, God and Man, in order that He might bring you to everlasting life, suffered that hard and hideous death on the Cross, and suffered His side to be opened, and Himself to be pierced to the heart, with that dreadful spear; — and so with that terrible stroke of the spear there gushed out of Christ's side that blissful flood of water and blood to ransom us, water of His side to wash us, and blood of His heart to buy us.

There was never sin of man nor of woman, thought nor wrought, that was washed with loving sorrow and hearty repentance, for which there is not in this well full remission to buy it, and water of life fully to cleanse and wash it.

Therefore rest here, take comfort here, live in Christ's Heart without end.
