

ST PETER & ST PAUL
(29 June, Holy Day of Obligation)

-Pope St Leo I (400-461) speaks to the Christian people of Rome about their Patrons-
 Dearly beloved, the whole world rejoices in every one of the Church's feast days. There is only one love of God, and whenever we call to mind those things which have been done for the salvation of all, they must be worth being joyfully commemorated by all. Nevertheless, this feast which we keep today, apart from that world-wide worship which it surely deserves, merits from this city of ours an outburst of gladness altogether special, altogether our own. In this very place, the two chiefest among the Apostles gloriously finished their race. On this day, when they lifted up their final testimony, let it be in this place that the memory of it receives the chiefest of jubilant celebrations.

O Rome! These two are the ones who brought the light of the Gospel of Christ to shine on you. These two are the ones by whom you were changed from being a teacher of lies, to a learner of the truth. These two are your fathers, these are truly your good shepherds, these two are the ones who laid better and happier heavenly foundations for you, than did those who first constructed your earthly ramparts, when he who gave you your name [Romulus] defiled them with his brother's [Remus] blood.

These are the ones who have set on your head this glorious crown of yours, for you have become a holy nation, a chosen people, a city at once Priestly and Royal; whom the sacred throne of blessed Peter has exalted, until you have become mistress of the world; to whom the world-wide love for God has given a wider lordship than that owned by any earthly empire. Once, you grew great by victories, until your power was spread proudly over land and sea: but that power of yours, won by the wearinesses of war, was narrower than that which you have now: that which has been laid at your feet by the peace of Christ.

It was fitting for the work decreed by God that the multitude of the kingdoms of the earth should be bound together under one rule, and that the universal preaching of the Gospel should in this way be brought more easily to all peoples, since all were governed by that empire of this city. But this city, ignorant of Him Who had been pleased to make her great, instead used her lordship over many nations to spread all their falsehoods. She seemed so mightily religious because there was no religion she rejected. But the more evil had bound Rome, the more wondrous was the work of Christ in setting her free.

As we have proved for ourselves, and as our forebears maintained, we believe, and we are sure that, amid all the toils of this life, we may always be assisted in obtaining God's mercy by the prayers of special intercessors, so that we can be raised up by the Apostles' merits even more than are weighed down by our own sins.
